Term dates

The academic year starts in late August and ends in early June. The academic year is divided into two semesters, an autumn semester and a spring semester. The autumn semester starts at the end of August and continues until mid-January of the following year. The spring semester starts in January and finishes at the beginning of June. Each semester is divided into 4 parts: Period 1 (A and B) and Period 2 (C and D).

• PS2STR Stress and health BA

(full time studies, period 2 D)
This module concerns aspects of psychological, biological, and social factors central to the field of stress and health. Within this remit, this module includes description and discussion of various topics such as the concepts of stress and health; psychobiological mechanisms, the interaction between stress and (un)health, burnout, lifestyle, pain and chronic illness, drug addiction and interaction between users and providers, prevention, treatment, rehabilitation and, primary and secondary prevention. Gender, age, socioeconomic status, culture, and various lifestyle factors will also be considered. Main research methods will be introduced with examples from current research projects.

• PS2FOR Psychological Essay BA

(full time studies, period 2 C, time table is flexible)
The course is loosely based around a short paper that each student writes, pretty much at their own pace, as long as it is handed in before the end of the semester. The idea for the course is that each student chooses something of special interest within the broad field of psychology and gathers the main ideas/theories/trends behind it in the form of a literature study. In the very beginning, each time the course is given, there is a seminar where students present their ideas for a literature study (no data collection or interviews) and they get matched with potential supervisors. From then on, it is self-paced, with varying degrees of interaction with respective supervisors. As the lit-reviews are not supposed to exceed 5-6 pages, this interaction is often rather minimal (often in the form of help with finding seminal studies to be used as a backbone of theory, as well as some help with polishing out the final version of the paper). Then, there is an examination-seminar, where students present and defend their papers, two and two, and get comments and grades from the teacher. Schedule is flexible.
